Staff is Hired! The GOOD SAMARITAN Outpatient Center OPENED ON MAY 14th!

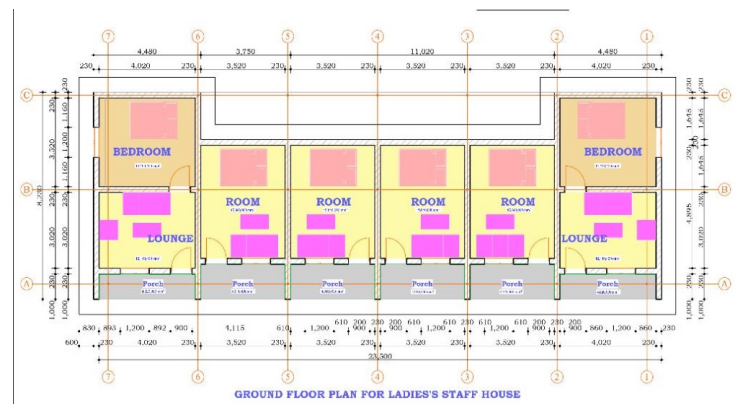
Hallelujah!! After many delays, starting with the onset of COVID-19, then compounded by severe damage from a freak wind storm and difficulties securing materials and labor for repairs, the Kibbuse Foundation Board has announced the hiring of the five medical professionals who will inaugurate services to the public out of the new facility. Clinic Administrator Rev. James Adyeri led the first all staff meeting and officially opened the Good Samaritan Outpatient Clinic on Friday, May 14th! Please pray for God's favor on these first weeks of operations.



KVTC DORMITORY CONSTRUCTION PLANS ARE FIRMING UP

What can \$70,000 buy in Uganda? How about a 24/48 bed dormitory, fully furnished and accompanied by new latrine and wash house!

The rendering you see above will be under construction as soon as we have assurance that it will be fully funded. Praise God: We have ALREADY received a little over half of the total funds needed (for the dormitory). This facility is essential to the growth and ongoing operation of the school. For twenty years, KVTC has operated with substandard rental and makeshift temporary dormitories. Because of this the school has been unable to apply for full accreditation from the Government and cannot offer required Government Exams to their own students. We're grateful for two recent gifts earmarked to purchase the 24 double tier durable iron bunk beds for the project. We are praying for ground-breaking in September, 2021 so that this facility can be available for the 2022 school year. Only your generous support will allow this to happen. Good Samaritan Clinic Staff Housing Progress

Lingering problems still present a big challenge to the fledgling staff. Local housing options are limited, most located nearly two miles from the clinic in the village of Itumero and grossly substandard. Small, windowless accommodations with dirt floors with no personal sanitary facilities and dusty backyard open-air cooking areas are not only inconvenient, but are actually a liability for health care professionals.

For this reason, Friends of Kibbuse has agreed to seek your help in funding construction of a modern, residential compound under the recently completed water harvesting shed. Shown above in floor plan, this residential block will provide four one-room and two two-room living quarters (for staff with families) under one roof to house the all-female staff. Rev. James will continue to reside in Nyamarwa at the vocational school compound and commute by motorcycle, thanks to another generous donor. A separate sanitary facility and cook house are included in the plan. Just under \$28,000 has been donated toward this \$60,000 project.
